Mobile-assisted language learning (MALL)

An expansion of the concept of Computerassisted language learning (CALL):

Learners use their mobile devices to assist their language learning.

(Burton, 2013)


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Why MALL?

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Seven billion people (95% of the global population) live in an area that is covered by a mobile-cellular network.

Mobile-broadband networks (3G or above) reach 84% of the global population but only 67% of the rural population.

LTE networks have spread quickly over the last three years and reach almost 4 billion people today (53% of the global population), enhancing the quality of Internet use.

In 2016, 7 billion people (95% of the global population) live in an area that is covered by a mobile-cellular network. There are as many mobile-cellular subscriptions as people in the world, with more than half in the Asia-Pacific region.

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Situation in Hong Kong

Hong Kongers Never Go Without their Smartphones:

> 96% of Users Browse the Internet Daily with their Smartphones, Highest Rate in Asia

Investigating students' mobile learning experiences in EdUHK

§ Investigatin students' habits and needs regarding mobile learning of English language

- § Participants / Subjects 113 students from various programmes (different majors of study) in the EdUHK
- § Methodology

Quantitative (Questionnaire survey) Qualitative (Interview)



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Findings - Questionnaire

- V Over 80% of participants prefer using their smartphone to improve English skills;
- v It is <u>convenient</u>, <u>portable</u> and <u>useful</u>;
- Most of the students use mobile devices for learning at school/dorm and during lectures/tutorials.



Findings - Questionnaire Reading

- Students prefer: surfing the internet for information of different topics, reading <u>online academic articles</u>, visiting <u>Facebook (or other social networking sites)</u>, reading <u>e-books</u> and <u>e-news</u>.
- <u>Nearly 70%</u> of the participants spend <u>at least 1 hour</u> a day to access the reading materials via their mobile devices.





 <u>Over 80%</u> of the participants spend <u>more than 1 hour per day listening to</u> <u>English music /watching video clips or</u> <u>movies</u> in English to practice English.



Findings - Questionnaire speaking

 Most participants use <u>websites/apps</u> to help improve their spoken English.
Some of them also use <u>voice chatting</u> or <u>mobile phone conversations</u> to practice spoken English.




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v Text messaging or chatting social networking apps or websites, emailing, blogging, and cloud documentation (Google Drive) are the most common and frequently used ways to improve written English.



Findings - Questionnaire What to include on the SNG website?



 Participants mostly prefer app reviews, videos of talks and students' sharing of learning experiences, so that they can <u>gain more ideas about the</u> <u>devices/apps for English learning</u>

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Findings - Interview Reflection on mobile learning behaviours

There are still some students who are less confident

- § Limitations of using mobile devices, e.g. small screen size, user-unfriendliness, high cost..
- § Easily distracted when using mobile devices/apps
- S Limited knowledge of devices/apps for learning and low frequency of using them



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






Mobile technologies have changed the way we use and study language.
